The individual must hold an AAPC certification, be a member in good standing and have at least five years coding experience.

Course Description:

The Physician Medical Coding Instructor Certification course prepares the candidate for a career in teaching future coders through comprehension of the coding curriculum, understanding the needs of adult learners, practical application, and teaching certification.

Note: Your CPC-I certification is not complete until both the written coding exam and verbal presentation are completed. The CPC-I written exam is 50 multiple choice coding questions; candidates must score at least 70% to pass. The exam must be taken at a proctored exam site. A 15 minute presentation is required and evaluated by peers; evaluation forms are submitted to AAPC for evaluation.
